	<p>Chairman Dave Wasgatt called the meeting to order at 7:02 PM.</p>		
	<p>Mr. Wasgatt voiced his concern about the number of opposing votes for our levy. He would like a better understanding of what we can do better as a board and is asking for feedback from the community. Each person that wants to speak will have 5 minutes a piece for a total of 30 minutes and the board may ask clarifying questions. This discussion cannot involve talking about specific students or staff.</p> <p>Mrs. Wellenbrock said that she loved the Tolo dance idea that involved the middle and high school students. She stated that there isn't a lot of extra things for kids to do besides sports. She would like to see swim lessons offered again. She is also concerned about the number of kids we are losing and has heard of possibly 5 more that might be leaving next year. Mr. Eldred shared that swimming lessons was on hold when we thought we were going to get more budget cuts. Mrs. Gimlin stated that it is on the list to talk about bringing it back tonight.</p> <p>Ms. Burgin expressed that the school traditions have been diminished and she is disappointed. For example, 8th grade graduation and homecoming coronation with the 8th grade girls. She said there is nothing for the younger kids to do. Mrs. Pierce asked her what she would suggest and if she would be willing to help. Ms. Burgin didn't</p>		<p>Communication to Board</p>

have any suggestions but said she would help. Ms. Burgin said that we need to do something different than Missoula Children's Theatre. Mr. Oldenburg remembered complaints long ago when high school students would pick the little girls they wanted to carry the crown and then there were kids getting left out.

Mr. Wasgatt asked if there were people interested in creating an organization of parents that could put on activities for kids.

Mr. Miller said this is the biggest crowd he has seen at a board meeting. Nobody has said anything to the board in a meeting and the community needs to step up and let us know if there are issues. Mrs. Sanchey asked Mr. Miller if he noticed things being different than when they were in school. Mr. Miller said he doesn't have kids in the school so he wouldn't know. Mrs. Pierce asked Mrs. Sanchey what she would suggest and if she would help. Mrs. Sanchey said that we don't have a P.T.O. and 8th grade graduation. She is also regretful of moving here and bringing her kids here to go to school. She wasn't interested in helping since she doesn't know if her kids will be here next year.

Mrs. Jones remembers 8th grade graduation being transitioned to the Friday before high school graduation and then it went to almost nothing. Mrs. Wellenbrock added that she doesn't want high school and 8th grade graduation on the same day so they don't compete. Mr. Wasgatt said that it is the class advisors job to bring ideas to Mrs. Gimlin and then on to the board concerning 8th grade promotion. Mrs. Burgin doesn't know why we stopped doing 8th grade graduation like we had done in the past. She would like her grandkids to have the same memories as her kids did. She also missed having a traditional Christmas program.

Ms. Burgin reported that there has been some communication to the school, but it doesn't do any good. She also stated that this year's Christmas program was not good. Furthermore, she looked forward to the Spring concert too. Ms. Burgin told the board she would be willing to help out teaching the kids some songs for concerts, but she hasn't been asked to help.

Mr. Gimlin expressed that everyone wants more things for our kids to do, but someone needs to step up and get things done.

Mr. Oldenburg made known that in the past the P.T.O. wanted to use school time for students to setup the Halloween carnival. A.S.B. laws state that the money would need to be receipted to the A.S.B. if school time was used for a fundraiser. Mrs. McFall remembered that the Halloween carnival ended up being ran by 2 people. Some parents in

	<p>the P.T.O. moved away and some didn't want to do it anymore and that is why it doesn't exist today.</p> <p>Mr. Troh expressed financial concerns for our school. The board should concentrate where they are spending money and where they are not. We have had budget cuts and some staff have lost hours. This year we didn't have more cuts, but some are getting raises. Mr. Troh questioned if the raises are justifiable. He asked if there is enough money for people to be getting raises, then maybe that money should go back to those people that lost money and hours. Also, Mr. Troh believes the average income in Glenwood is about \$40,000 and why should people ask for more if they are already making more than that. Class fundraising has also changed because some the board thinks the community believes our senior trips are too extravagant. If that is the case then I would stop supporting the fundraisers that kids are doing.</p> <p>Mrs. Patterson said she would be willing to set up a table at the Missoula Children's Theatre for P.T.O. signups. She doesn't want to lead the P.T.O. but she would love to help. She expressed that she loves this school and her kids thrive here.</p>	
	<p>Mrs. Gimlin shared the following information with the board:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • With our water grant, our faucets will be tested again with the replaced faucets. • We have Mrs. Pierce and Mr. Eldred attending the Small Schools Conference next month along with Mrs. Gimlin. • The levy passed by one vote and it has certified. • The Spelling Bee was on February 12th and about half of the kids participated. • Swimming lessons was not budgeted this year, but she would like to bring it back this summer. • Our teachers had professional development with an E.S.D. STEM trainer on February 26th. • Missoula Children's Theatre will be here March 2nd-6th. • Smokey the Bear will be here on March 11th. • K-5th grades will be attending The Jungle Book play in Portland on February 28th. • The middle and high school attended the Broadway show, Dear Evan Hansen in Portland. • We have students and staff participating in Sources of Strength. • Centerville invited our high school students to their school for a concert starring Jessica Lynne on March 11th. 	<p>Superintendent's Report</p>
